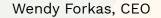

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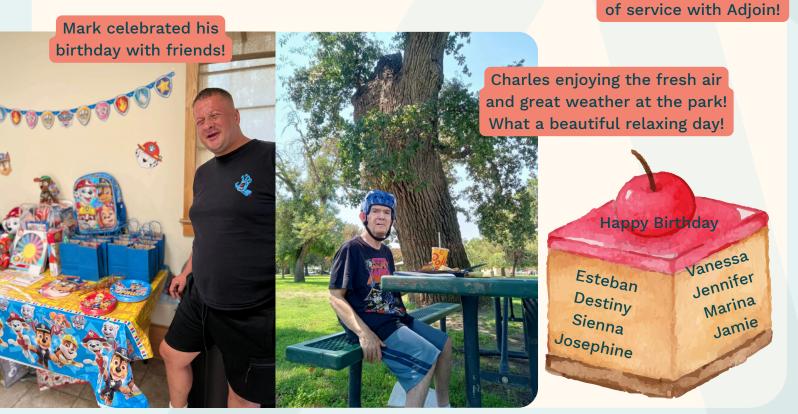

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Client Spotlight



Avery joined the Catalysts Division IL program in 2019. The first few years were rough. Avery was living with her parents but was not happy and wanted a home of her own. She had a part-time job that did not give her the income she needed to move out. She also found herself using drugs to cope with her unhappy Work/living arrangements. When Avery joined the IL program, one of the first things she wanted was to get away from her current environment where she had easy access to drugs. She made the choice to go into rehabilitation to get clean miles away from her home. After exiting the treatment facility, she initially moved to a "Support Home" that helped her stay on track. After awhile of living CLEAN she was able to increase her work hours to full time. With full time employment, she was able to get her own apartment. With the changes Avery made in her life over the last few years, one of the successes she has is rebuilding the relationship she has with her parent. Her parents now come down on a regular basis and spend weekends with Avery. They spend several nights each month with Avery and have created the relationship Avery always wanted.



Ron used the One Flutter Day of Change program to drive this sweet dog up north to her new home! I know how you enjoy uplifting stories at the beginning of your week. Marnix here, was supposed to be put down a week or so ago, but received an extension until yesterday, Sunday. The sanctuary that I support, was able to extend it for one more day, so I could pick him up and return him to his new home.

CLIENT ABUSE & NEGLECT

Adjoin has NO tolerance for client/participant abuse or neglect

We consider the health & safety of all our clients to be the most important part of our services.



KNOW THE TYPES!

Physical: Any acts that result in injury.

Financial: Exploitation of client's funds/assets. Sexual: Any non-consenting sexual acts/behaviors.

Neglect: Failure of person with custody to exercise reasonable degree of care.

Abandonment: Desertion of client by caregiver.

Abduction: The removal of the client to another state without consent. Isolation: Intentional prevention of client receiving mail, calls, or visitors.

Mental Suffering: Forms of emotional distress brought about by intimidating behavior.

ABUSE REPORTING PROCESS!







Team members have reasonable belief that client abuse has occurred



Must be reported to (as applicable):

- 1. Manager
- 2. County Adult Protective Services
- 3. Regional Center, DOR, or VA
- 4. Local police
- 5. County Ombudsman Office
- 6. Conservator



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FLU SEASON SAFETY



Each year, flu infects 5-20% of Americans, causing over 200,000 hospitalizations and 36,000 deaths (CDC)

BE READY!





Regularly wipe shared surfaces—keyboards, doorknobs, phones—with effective cleaners

Wash hands 20+ seconds, cover coughs/sneezes with tissue or elbow, avoid touching face

STAYING SAFE



Flu shots reduce illness severity and protect coworkers; best time is October-November

Use ventilation, open windows, or HEPA air purifiers to reduce airborne viruses

Prevent spreading flu by resting until fever-free for 24 hours without meds
